If you're dealing with a significant amount of spam and find yourself adding new words to the list daily or moderating comments frequently, we recommend using the Simple Google reCAPTCHA plugin instead.

For spam received through contact forms, we suggest installing Fluent Forms as it offers robust spam protection. If needed, you can replace your current forms with Fluent Forms for enhanced spam prevention.

## 19. Custom Login Page Customizer

The login page primarily serves as a bridge between your website and the user's account. Since it doesn't require extensive functionality or styling, it's recommended to keep it light and make minimal customizations. A simple and effective customization is changing the login logo. To achieve this, you can easily find step-by-step guides by searching "How to Easily Change the Login Logo in WordPress" on search engines like Google. And afterwards, we would recommend you remove this plugin.

## 20. Custom Post Type UI

- If you use NGINX, the process is slightly more complex. You'll need to add the redirections to your configuration file located at /etc/nginx/sites-available.
